


Stay on Top of your Lab/Imaging Tests That Need Completing

Use this page to view the lab and/or image tests your UR Medicine health care providers request you complete. You now have a combined list of standing and future orders. Below, you will find an example screenshot; **continue to page 2** for more detailed information.

Remember, it's important when you are viewing your own **Labs/Test To Do** that you carefully review the dates pertaining to visits or procedures. They may require you to complete them in a certain timeframe for those appointments.

1. **Standing Orders:** These tests are those that your health care provider wants you to complete on a regular basis, or as needed (also known as PRN). If you see the words “Interval” or “Remaining”, this means that it is a standing order. #4 (Refer to Screen Shot on page 1) is an example of another standing order.
 - A. **Name:** This is the name of the ordered test.
Ordered by: This is the health care provider who officially approved the order for your test. Sometimes this will NOT be the provider who talked to you about the test. This is because UR Medicine is a teaching institution, and often our medical students and residents interact with patients, but then discuss the care with a supervising physician, who in turn approves the test in our system.
Date: This is the date your health care provider ordered the test in our system. This will often be the date when you had an office visit with your health care provider.
 - B. **Remaining:** This helps you to keep track of how many tests you have completed (the first number), and how many more tests your health care provider wants you to complete (the second number).
 - C. **Last Done:** This is the last date of your most recent test completed.
 - D. **Interval:** This is how often you should repeat tests
 - E. **Expires:** This is the last date you have to complete this test.

2. **Future Orders:** These tests are those that your health care provider wants you to complete, and there may be a specific time period that the test results should be completed. If you see the word “Expected”, this means that this is a future order. #3 (Refer to Screen Shot on page 1) is an example of another future order.
 - F. **Name:** This is the name of the ordered test.
Ordered by: This is the health care provider who officially approved the order for your test. Sometimes this will NOT be the provider who talked to you about the test. This is because UR Medicine is a teaching institution, and often our medical students and residents interact with patients, but then discuss the care with a supervising physician, who in turn approves the test in our system.
Date: This is the date your health care provider ordered the test in our system. This will often be the date when you had an office visit with your health care provider.
 - G. **Expected:** This is the beginning of the time period to complete the test. It is an approximated date when the test should be completed.
 - H. **Expires:** This is the last date you have to complete this test.
